Anand Sharma is a B.Arch (Hons) graduate from the Indian Institute of Technology, Kharagpur, and a co-founder at Design Forum International. He is a firm believer in practising socially inclusive architecture and coined the term "People-First", which became one of the guiding principles of the practice.

Over 25 years, Anand has been instrumental in the firm's journey of being a part of 'Nation-Building' across

the country. He has worked across diverse project typologies, where he leverages his expertise in architecture, engineering and construction to provide unique, and efficient design solutions. He has played a key role in leading large scale commercial projects such as the Select City Walk Mall (Delhi) and Guwahati City Centre, the largest retail mall in Guwahati. He has also worked on competitions for civic infrastructure developments including Dakshineswar Skywalk (Kolkata), ITO Foot over Bridge (New Delhi) and the upcoming Multi-Modal Logistics and Transport Hub (Dadri), among others, and is currently leading the New Integrated Terminal Building (NITB) at the Guwahati International Airport and the Bihta Airport (Bihar), modelled on the ideas of environment-conscious and humancentric design.

Sharma believes that cities must have a distinct character and an architect's role as a facilitator of change is to create contextually and socially relevant designs. Calling on his profession to rethink the approach to building design for the most impoverished communities, Anand, a philanthropist has been accredited for creating some of the major affordable housing projects in Delhi NCR, and the first-ever affordable housing project in the North-East India.

Anand has participated as a keynote

speaker at various events including General Business Meet organized by and at Indian Habitat Centre (IHC), where he presented DFI's and Airport Authority of India's collective aspirations behind the design of Guwahati International Airport's new terminal building. Further, he represented DFI at the Airport Authority of India (AAI), BIM Conference held at Indian Aviation Academy in Delhi and shared his experience and observation on how BIM is a sustainable autonomous and efficient solution to deal with complex and demanding environments of a live construction site. As a keynote speaker at Autodesk University India conference in 2019, Anand talked about the use of BIM in major infrastructure projects.

Anand is also a talented singer and a literary enthusiast. Holding expertise in real estate trends, he frequently addresses real estate issues and provides insights into the latest trends on various platforms such as Realty Plus, 99 acres, Magic Bricks and Windows and Façade Magazine. He is a frequent contributor to various newspapers and magazines including, The Morning Standard, Hindustan Times, India Today Home and The Times Property among others. In 2019, Anand has been felicitated by highly respectable personalities of India such as Padma Bhushan Shri Rajeev Sethi at the IndeXcellence Awards Ceremony.



Design Forum International (DFI) is a New Delhi based architectural practice that is firmly rooted in the "Peoplefirst" approach to design. Founded in 1995 by three graduates from the Indian Institute of Technology (Kharagpur), Anand Sharma, Anoj Tevatia and Goonmeet Singh Chauhan envisioned the practice to foster an egalitarian organization ethos, where distinct architectural talent could find selfexpression and contribute towards the development of humancentric architecture in a collaborative work environment.

Since its inception, the practice has been a witness to the unfolding journey of India; from being a third-world country to the fastest growing economy. Through the diverse portfolio including projects across residential, retail, workplaces, recreational, hospitality, institutional, master planning and civic infrastructure, DFI endeavours to contribute to this oncein-a-lifetime opportunity of being a part of "Nation Building". Spread across the nation, their notable projects; The New Court Blocks at Delhi High Court, New Integrated Terminal Building at Guwahati International Airport, Dakshineswar SkyWalk (Kolkata), ITO Skywalk (Delhi), Select City Walk Mall (Delhi), Redevelopment of Amritsar Junction Railway Station (Punjab), Proposed Redevelopment of Azadpur (Delhi), Navami Funique Township (Bangalore), Rang Homes and Guwahati City Centre (Guwahati)—the largest mall in the North East, among others have set benchmarks in the Indian built environment.

With a portfolio that is spread across 17 states in the country, since its inception, the practice has delivered over fifty million sq. ft. of residential, ten million sq. ft. of retail-cum-mixed use, ten million sq. ft. of workplace, over five thousand acres of campuses, and institutions ranging from a 5-acre school to 500 acres of professional training colleges. Over the years, the practice has grown from strength to strength and is currently marching ahead with a team of over 100 professionals, each pursuing a distinctive value-based architectural spirit and executing projects with a deep sense of optimism, excellence, and integrity. Being an agent of change, their efforts are rooted in principles of sustainable architecture and response to the local context while simultaneously ensuring that humans remain central to design.

DFI has won many national and international accolades for their diverse oeuvre of work, including the Index Excellence Award in 2019, IIA Award in 2017, NTDV's Grohe design and architecture award in 2014 and again in 2017, the Construction Week Awards in 2018 for the New Courts Complex at Delhi High Court in New Delhi, and the Outstanding Paper and Design Work in 2017 at UIA Seoul Congress for the Helix tower. Their works have time and again found a place in esteemed newspapers and various Architecture, Design and Real Estate magazines such as Architecture + Design, Architect and Interiors India, Realty Plus, India Today Home, The Morning Standard, Asian Age, and Economic Times among others. # **Design Philosophy**

- To embellish with thoughtful contemporary interventions that echo the aspirations of our times, while discarding architectural vestiges.

The firm employs a versatile approach to design, consciously staying clear of restrictions of project typologies – they have worked across residential, workplace, recreational, retail, master planning, hospitality, institutional, campuses, and civic infrastructure typologies. DFI has actively contributed to the once-in-lifetime opportunity of being part of "Nation Building" by creating iconic projects such as The New Court Blocks at Delhi High Court, Dakshineswar SkyWalk in Kolkata, ITO Skywalk in Delhi, Redevelopment of Amritsar Junction Railway Station and the New Integrated Terminal Building at Guwahati International Airport among others.

DFI is a 'People-first' organization, spotting talent early, and grooming it well. The approach is not bounded by any school of thought and centres on novelty in design. Processes inform the outcome –predetermined, preprogrammed workflow is followed with missionary zeal. At the heart of this thought is the belief that, while people may falter, processes never do.

DFI is abreast of all regulations, bye-laws, trends, and market scenarios, pertinent to individual markets. Experiences drawn from one territory very frequently find parallels in another and enrich the knowledge base, bringing substantial value enhancement to projects. While the entire team assigned to a client is available for discussion and direction on a project, there is a singular point of contact for the client: The Head of the concerned team, a Director or an Assistant Director-level professional. It is a matter of pride that 65% of the practice's order book is repeat assignments with satisfied clients.
